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## 1. How did the woman of Samaria testify of the Jewish expectation of the Messiah, or the Christ?

John 4:25, "The woman saith unto him, I know that Messias cometh, which is called Christ: when He is come, He will tell us all things."

In the New Testament the name Christ is used as equivalent to the Hebrew, Messiah, anointed, the name given to the long-promised Prophet and King whom the Jews had been taught by their prophets to expect.

### 2. What declaration did Jesus Christ make to her concerning Himself?

John 4:26, "<u>Jesus saith unto her, I that speak unto thee am He</u>."

Matt 26:63-64, "But Jesus held His peace. And the high priest answered and said unto Him, I adjure Thee by the living God, that Thou tell us whether Thou be the Christ, the Son of God. Jesus saith unto him, Thou hast said: nevertheless I say unto you, Hereafter shall ye see the Son of man sitting on the right hand of power, and coming in the clouds of Heaven."

### 3. What evidence did Jesus Christ offer His disciples in support of His claim?

Luke 24:25-27, "Then He said unto them, O fools, and slow of heart to believe allthat the prophets have spoken: Ought not Christ to have suffered these things, and to enter into His glory? And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, He expounded unto them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself."

#### 4. How was the Messiah to be manifested?

Isaiah 9:6, "For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given: and the government shall be upon His shoulder: and His name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace."

Matthew 1:22, 23, "Now all this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a Son, and they shall call His name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us."

Isaiah 7:14, "<u>Therefore the Lord Himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel."</u>

#### 5. Upon what human line of descent would He come?

Isaiah 11:1, "And there shall come forth a Rod out of the stem of Jesse, and a Branch shall grow out of his roots."

Matthew 1:1, "The book of the generation of Jesus Christ, the Son of David, the Son of Abraham."

#### 6. Where would Messiah be born?

Micah 5:2, "But thou, Bethlehem
Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall He come forth unto Me that is to be Ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting."

Matthew 2:4-6, "And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he demanded of them where Christ should be born. And they said unto him, In Bethlehem of Judaea: for thus it is

written by the prophet, And thou Bethlehem, in the land of Juda, art not the least among the princes of Juda: for out of thee shall come a Governor, that shall rule My people Israel."

#### 7. In what miraculous way would He be conceived?

Isaiah 7:14, "Therefore the Lord Himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel."

Matthew 1:20, "But while he thought on these things, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a dream, saying, Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for That which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit."

### 8. What danger would threaten His early years?

Jeremiah 31:15, "Thus saith the LORD; A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation, and bitter weeping; Rahel weeping for her children refused to be comforted for her children, because they were not."

Matthew 2:16-18, "Then Herod, when he saw that he was mocked of the wise men, was exceeding wroth, and sent forth, and slew all the children that were in Bethlehem, and in all the coasts thereof, from two years old and under, according to the time which he had diligently inquired of the wise men. Then was fulfilled that which was spoken by Jeremy the prophet, saying, In Rama was there a voice heard, lamentation, and weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, and would not be comforted, because they are not."

#### 9. Where would He be temporarily exiled?

Hosea 11:1, "When Israel was a child, then I loved Him, and called my Son out of Egypt."

Matthew 2:13-15, "And when they were departed, behold, the angel of the Lord appeareth to Joseph in a dream, saying, Arise, and take the young Child and his mother.

Isaiah 40:3, "The voice of him that crieth in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God."

### 11. What would be the nature of the Messiah's blessed ministry?

Isaiah 61:1, "The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon Me; because the LORD hath anointed Me to preach good tidings unto the meek; He hath sent Me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to them that are bound."

Luke 4:16-19, "And He came to Nazareth, where He had been brought up: and, as His custom was. He went into the synagogue on the sabbath day, and stood up for to read.

And there was delivered unto Him the Book of the prophet Esaias. And when He had opened the Book, He found the place where it was written, The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; He hath sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised, To preach the acceptable year of the Lord."

### 12. Before His passion what symbolic exaltation would He receive?

Zechariah 9:9, "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion; shout, O daughter of Jerusalem: behold, thy King cometh unto thee: He is just, and having salvation; lowly, and riding upon an ass, and upon a colt the foal of an ass."

Luke 19:35, "And they brought him to Jesus: and they cast their garments upon the colt, and they set Jesus thereon."

#### 13. By whom would Messiah be betrayed?

Psalm 41:9, "Yea, Mine own familiar friend, in whom I trusted, which did eat of My bread, hath lifted up his heel against Me."

Luke 22:3, "Then entered Satan into Judas surnamed Iscariot, being of the number of the twelve."

John 13:2, "And supper being ended, the devil having now put into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray Him."

John 13 21-26, "When Jesus had thus said, He was troubled in spirit, and testified, and said, Verily, verily, I say unto you, that one of you shall betray Me. Then the disciples looked one on another, doubting of whom He spake. Now there was leaning on Jesus' bosom one of His disciples, whom Jesus loved. Simon Peter therefore beckoned to him, that he should ask who it should be of whom He spake. He then lying on Jesus' breast saith unto Him, Lord, who is it? Jesus answered, He it is, to whom I shall give a sop, when I have dipped it. And when He had dipped the sop, He gave it to Judas Iscariot, the son of Simon."

#### 14. For what price would He be sold?

Zechariah 11:12, "And I said unto them, If ye think good, give Me My price; and if not, forbear. So they weighed for My price thirty pieces of silver."

Matthew 26:14-16, "Then one of the twelve, called Judas Iscariot, went unto the chief priests, And said unto them, What will ye give me, and I will deliver Him unto you? And they covenanted with him for thirty

pieces of silver. And from that time he sought opportunity to betray Him."

### 15. In what spirit would He endure His sufferings?

Isaiah 53:7, "He was oppressed, and He was afflicted, yet He opened not His mouth: He is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so He openeth not His mouth."

Mark 15:3-5, "And the chief priests accused Him of many things: but He answered nothing. And Pilate asked Him again, saying, Answerest Thou nothing? behold how many things they witness against Thee. But Jesus yet answered nothing; so that Pilate marvelled."

#### 16. How were Messiah's vicarious sufferings foretold?

Isaiah 53:5, "<u>But He was wounded for our transgressions</u>, He was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon Him; and with His stripes we are healed."

Matthew 8:17, "That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Esaias the prophet, saying, Himself took our infirmities, and bare our sicknesses."

#### 17. How exactly were the details of the crucifixion foretold?

Psalm 22:16, "For dogs have compassed Me: the assembly of the wicked have inclosed Me: they pierced My hands and My feet."

Psalm 22:18, "They part My garments among them, and cast lots upon My vesture."

John 19:24, "They said therefore among themselves, Let us not rend it, but cast lots for it, whose it shall be: that the Scripture might be fulfilled, which saith, They parted My raiment among them, and for My vesture they did cast lots. These things therefore the soldiers did."

#### 18. Where would Messiah rest in death?

Isaiah 53:9, "And He made His grave with the wicked, and with the rich in His death; because He had done no violence, neither was any deceit in His mouth."

Matthew 27:57-60, "When the even was come, there came a rich man of Arimathaea, named Joseph, who also himself was Jesus' disciple: He went to Pilate, and begged the body of Jesus. Then Pilate commanded the body to be delivered. And when Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth, And laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn out in the rock: and he rolled a great stone to the door of the sepulchre, and departed."

#### 19. In what words were His resurrection foreshadowed?

Psalm 16:10, "For Thou wilt not leave My soul in hell; neither wilt Thou suffer Thine Holy One to see corruption."

Acts 2:25-27, "For David speaketh concerning Him, I foresaw the Lord always before my face, for He is on my right hand, that I should not be moved: Therefore did my heart rejoice, and my tongue was glad; moreover also my flesh shall rest in hope: Because Thou wilt not leave My soul in hell, neither wilt Thou suffer Thine Holy One to see corruption."

# 20. In view of His minute fulfillment of Messianic prophecy how confidently did the apostle Paul witness that Jesus Christ was the Messiah?

Acts 17:2, 3, "And Paul, as his manner was, went in unto them, and three sabbath days reasoned with them out of the Scriptures, Opening and alleging, that Christ must needs have suffered, and risen again from the dead; and that this Jesus, whom I preach unto you, is Christ."

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
