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GENESIS

Book of Beginnings

Gen. 2:7 Then the LORD God formed man of dust from the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living being.

Isa. 43:1 But now, thus says the LORD, your Creator, O Jacob, And He who formed [yatzar] you, O Israel, "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name; you are Mine!"

3. What does Scripture say:

Isa. 2:22 Stop regarding man, whose breath of life is in his nostrils;
For why should he be esteemed?

Isa. 57:16 "For I will not contend forever,

Nor will I always be angry; For the spirit would grow faint before Me,

And the breath of those whom I have made"

Job 1:21 He said, "Naked I came from my mother's womb, And naked I shall return there. The LORD gave and the LORD has taken away. Blessed be the name of the LORD."

1. Birth (noun) usually used with a preposition. There is no noun for birth in Hebrew. Thus when you have to express the prepositional phrase, you use mibeten, "from the womb," or bebeten, "in the womb." One synonym is miracham, used in Psa. 22:10; 58:4 Job 1:21 He said, "Naked I came from my mother's womb, And naked I shall return there. The LORD gave and the LORD has taken away. Blessed be the name of the LORD."

Job 3:11 "Why did I not die at birth,

Come forth from the womb and expire?"

Job 10:19 'I should have been as though I had not been, Carried from womb to tomb.'

Psa. 22:9 Yet You are He who brought me forth from the womb; You made me trust when upon my mother's breasts.

Psa. 22:10 Upon You I was cast from birth;

You have been my God from my mother's womb.

Psa. 58:3 The wicked are estranged from the womb;
These who speak lies go astray from birth.

Isa. 44:2 Thus says the LORD who made you

And formed you from the womb, who will help you, 'Do not fear, O Jacob My servant;

And you Jeshurun whom I have chosen.'

Isa. 44:24 Thus says the LORD, your Redeemer, and the one who formed you from the womb,

"I, the LORD, am the maker of all things,

Stretching out the heavens by Myself

And spreading out the earth all alone,"

2. Conceive (verb) harah

Gen. 4:1 Now the man had relations with his wife Eve, and she conceived and gave birth to Cain, and she said, "I have gotten a manchild with the kelp of the LORD." harah

Gen. 4:17 Cain had relations with his wife and she conceived, and gave birth to Enoch; and he built a city, and called the name of the city Enoch, after the name of his son.
