Summary of Dan's Tribal History

1. The descendents of Dan displayed wonderful achievements as well as gross failure.

2. The Danites were the second most numerous tribe in the wilderness, yet they failed to secure their possession in the land due to their trend toward spiritual compromise and failure to exclusively trust God. (Num. 2:26; 26:42; Judges 1)

3. Aholiab, Bezalel's assistant on constructing the tabernacle and Samson, the womanizing, self-absorbed judge are the two most widely known Danites. (Exodus 31:6; 35:34)

4. Dan was blessed by Moses who refers to the tribe as a "lion's cub" (Deut 33:22).

5. The period of the Judges showed both their greatest successes and their greatest flaws.

6. Though some have argued that the antichrist comes from Dan, this cannot be supported biblically. The tribe is omitted from the genealogies in 1 Chron 2–10.


