Matthew 11:28, "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest."

The Doctrine of Eternal Security

1. Definition:

The work of God toward the believer at the instant of faith alone in Christ alone

which guarantees that God's free gift of salvation is eternal and cannot be lost, terminated, abrogated, nullified, or reversed

by any thought, act, or change of belief in the person saved. When a person trusts in Christ

for salvation

God permanently justifies and regenerates and gives eternal life,

and this can not be lost, no matter what that person does or does not do from that instant on until the day he dies. 2. Other terms for this are once saved always saved; assurance of salvation and eternal security.

Eternal Security refers to the objective work of the triune God in keeping us saved. This is often called the objective aspect of this doctrine.

Assurance of Salvation is the subjective side, the individual's believers realization and confidence that he is indeed saved and cannot lose that salvation.

3. The Historic Positions

High Calvinism

- Total Depravity; Total Inability
- Unconditional Election
- Limited Atonement
- Irresistible Grace
- Perseverance of the Saints

Classic Arminianism: Jacob Arminius, (1560–1609), followers believe a saved person can lose salvation only by a complete denial of Christ. Once this occurs they can never again be saved.

Wesleyan Arminianism. Wesley, 1703–1791.

Salvation can be lost through any serious intentional sin.

"I cannot believe... that there is a state attainable in this life from which a man cannot finally fall." "I find no general promise in holy writ 'that none who once believes shall finally fall."

"On this authority [Ezek 18:24], I believe a saint may fall away; that one who is holy or righteous in the judgment of God himself may nevertheless so fall from God as to perish everlastingly."

"They whom God hath accepted in his Beloved, effectually called and sanctified by His Spirit can neither totally nor finally fall away from the state of grace, but shall certainly persevere therein to the end and be eternally saved."

The Westminster Confession of Faith

"The doctrine of perseverance requires careful statement, especially in view of the fact that the term 'perseverance of the saints' is liable to misunderstanding.... We should guard against the possible misunderstanding that this perseverance is regarded as an inherent property of the believer or as a continuous activity of man, by means of which he perseveres in the way of salvation."

Louis Berkhof, Systematic Theology


