Heb. 9:13, "For if the blood of bulls and goats and the ashes of a heifer, sprinkling the unclean, sanctifies for the purifying of the flesh,"

Col. 1:22, "yet He has now reconciled you in His fleshly body through death, in order to present you before Him holy and blameless and beyond reproach —"

λατρευω (*latreu* \bar{o}), serve; λατρεια (*latreia*), service or worship (of God)

1. Before a person can serve or worship God, they must be justified, forgiven, and regenerated.

2. We serve God through prayer and worship.

 Luke 2:37, "and this woman was a widow of about eighty-four years, who did not depart from the temple, but served God with fastings and prayers night and day." 3. We serve God in terms of our spiritual growth and use of our spiritual gifts.

 Acts 27:23, "For there stood by me this night an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I serve," 4. Just as there are only two options: Divine viewpoint or human viewpoint; God's knowledge and truth or Satan's, we either serve God or Satan (self, man, the creature).

 Rom. 1:25, "who exchanged the truth of God for the lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen." 5. Our service must be empowered by the Holy Spirit.

 Phil. 3:3, "For we are the circumcision, who worship God (by means of) the Spirit, rejoice in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence in the flesh,"

- 6. Our present service prepares us for our future eternal service.
 - Rev. 7:15, "Therefore they are before the throne of God, and serve Him day and night in His temple. And He who sits on the throne will dwell among them."
 - Rev. 22:3, "And there shall be no more curse, but the throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it, and His servants shall serve Him."

Heb. 9:15, "And for this reason He is the Mediator of the new covenant, so that, since a death has taken place for the redemption of the transgressions that were *committed* under the first covenant, that those who are called may receive the promise of the eternal inheritance." $K\alpha\iota \ \delta\iota\alpha \ \tau ov\tau o$ Literally because of this i.e., because of the superiority of His death that cleanses our consciousness.

Heb. 7:22, "so much the more also Jesus has become the guarantee of a better covenant."

Heb. 8:6, "But now He has obtained a more excellent ministry, by as much as He is also the mediator of a better covenant, which has been enacted on better promises."

Redemption. The recalling of captives (sinners) from captivity (sin) through the payment of a ransom for them, i.e., Christ's death.

So that those who are called may receive the promise of the eternal inheritance, a death having come about for the redemption of the transgressions of the first covenant.
