
# The Doctrine of "One Another"

# 17. Think about one another to stir up to love and good deeds.

Heb. 10:24, "And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works [application of doctrine in thought, word, actions]"

18. Confess to one another, i.e., apologize when you wrong someone, not public self-flagellation.



19. Pray for one another.

James 5:16, "Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much."



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#### INTERPRETIVE KEYS

1. Understand 3 words: suffering, sick, heal.

2. Context: Immediate, intermediate, the whole epistle.

# JAMES 5:13

"Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing psalms."

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κακοπαθεω; kakopatheia

"to suffer physical pain, hardship and distress" – 'to suffer distress, to suffer pain, suffering hardship.'
Adversity.

"As an example, brethren, of suffering and patience, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord."

#### THE PROBLEM: OUR OWN ARROGANCE

Unrealistic vs. realistic expectations

Legitimate vs. illegitimate expectations

Legitimate vs. presumptuous expectations

"Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing psalms."

εὖθυμεῶ, *euthemeo* present active indicative;

"to be or to become encouraged and hence cheerful" – 'to be encouraged, to take courage, to become encouraged.'

# JAMES 5:14

"Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord."

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ἀσθενεω astheneo

lit. "without strength" to be weak, powerless; to be sick, or to be without money, financially destitute.

Matt. 25:44, "Then they themselves also will answer, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry, or thirsty, or a stranger, or naked, or sick, or in prison, and did not take care of You?' "

Matt. 26:41, "Keep watching and praying that you may not enter into temptation; the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak."



1 Cor. 11:30, "For this reason many among you are weak and sick, and a number sleep."

ἄρρωστος, *appostos*, "ill, sick, an invalid"

"Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord."

ἀλείφω *aleipho*, "to anoint."

For the purpose of refreshment, hygiene, and beauty.

In contrast to  $\chi \rho i \omega$  (chri $ar{o}$ ), anoint; which is ceremonial and spiritual.

## SOZO — MEANING TO DELIVER, TO SAVE

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σφζω (s\bar{o}z\bar{o}), save, keep from harm, preserve, rescue;
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ἀφίημι (aphiēmi), let go, cancel, remit, leave, forgive;

ίάομαι (iaomai), to cure, to restore;

έγειρω *egeiro*, to lift up physically or spiritually.

"Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed earnestly that it would not rain; and it did not rain on the land for three years and six months."

"And he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain, and the earth produced its fruit."



James 1:2, "My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials,

James 1:3, "knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience.

James 1:4, "But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing.

James 1:5, "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him.

James 1:6, "But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for he who doubts is like a wave of the sea driven and tossed by the wind.

James 1:7, "For let not that man suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord;

James 1:8, "he is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways."

"Brethren, if anyone among you wanders from the truth, and someone turns him back,"





"Let him know that he who turns a sinner from the error of his way will save a soul from death and cover a multitude of sins."
