




- **1. Rameses II was the Pharaoh of the Exodus**

γεννηθεὶς *gennetheis* "to be born" anarthrous aor pass participle, the aor ptcp would precede the action of the main verb.

The participle is an adverbial ptcp of time, so should be translated, *after* he was born, not *when* he was born.

Ex. 2:1, "And a man of the house of Levi went and took as wife a daughter of Levi.

Ex. 2:2, "So the woman conceived and bore a son. And when she saw that he was a beautiful child, she hid him three months." Acts 7:20, "At this time Moses was born, and was well pleasing to God; and he was brought up in his father's house for three months."

"after becoming great" or "after becoming an adult"

ἀρνέομαι arneomai

aor mid indic 3 sing

"to renounce, refuse to consent to something, to disdain, to reject, to deny something to be true"

αίρέω haireō

aor mid ptcp of means

"by choosing" to take up,

in the middle voice it means to choose or select something of one's own volition.
