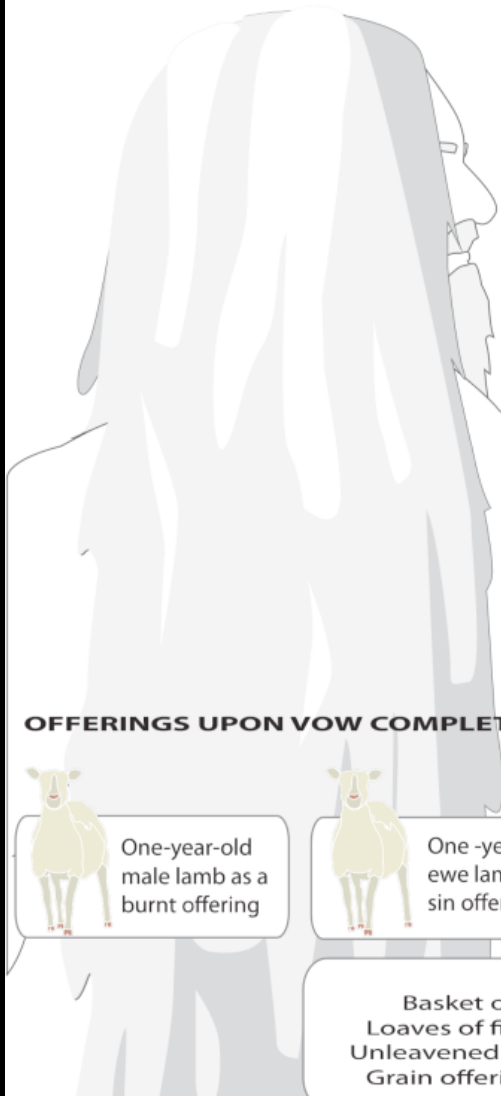
The Nazirite Vow

"And the Lord spoke to Moses saying, 'Speak to the people of Israel and say to them, when either a man or a woman makes a special vow, the vow of a Nazirite, to separate themselves to the Lord...' Numbers 6: 1-2

TWO PATHS TO SERVICE

God-ordained lifelong calling from conception including Samson, Samuel and John the Baptist

Short-term commitment as a sign of penitence and devotion including the Apostle Paul and many other Israelite men and women



PROHIBITIONS:



- No drinking wine, eating grapes or consuming anything produced by the vine

- No cutting hair or shaving head

- No visiting burial sites

IN THE EVENT OF DEFILEMENT:



- Shave head
- Two turtle doves and one male lamb as offerings to priest

- Recommit to vow

OFFERINGS UPON VOW COMPLETION:



One-year-old male lamb as a burnt offering



One-year-old ewe lamb as a sin offering

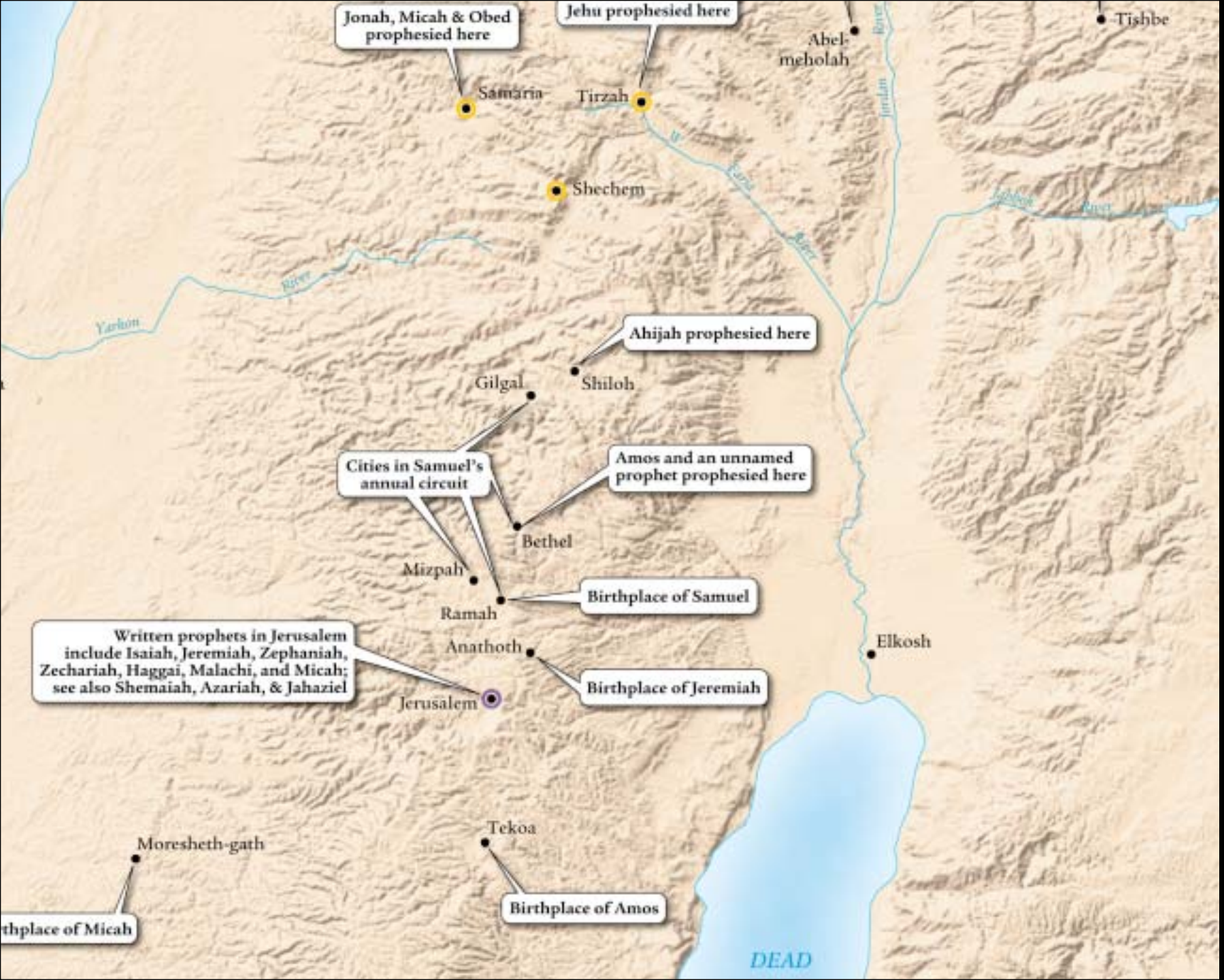


Ram as a peace offering

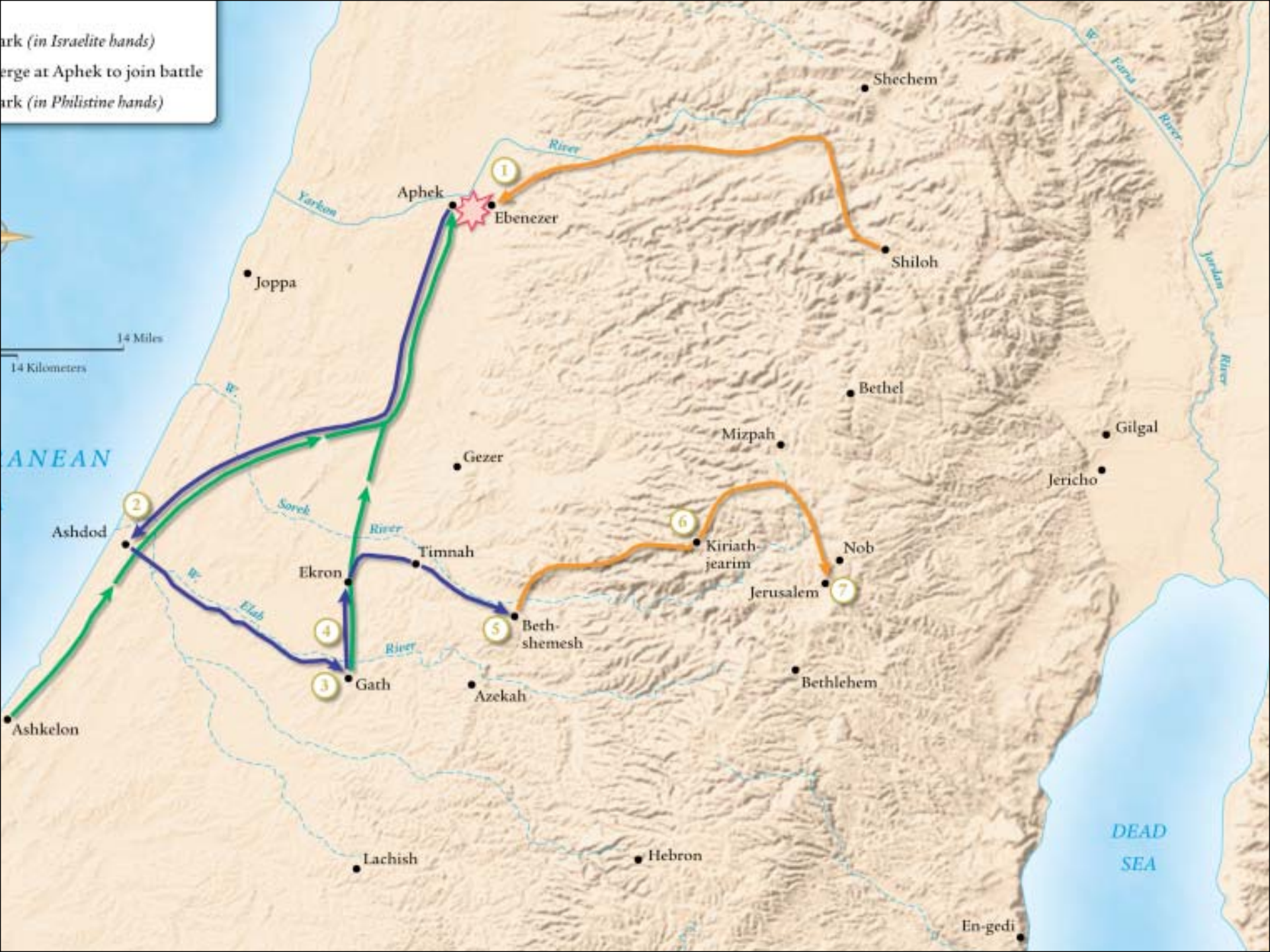


Shave head, place hair under fire of peace offering

As well as:
Basket of unleavened bread
Loaves of fine flour mixed with oil
Unleavened wafers smeared with oil
Grain offering and Drink offerings
