3. How we are able to run the race

English looks like two commands:

Let us lay aside

and

Let us run

But that would be wrong!

ἀποτίθημι *apotithemi*

aor mid part masc plur nom

to put off, away, remove clothes

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τρέχω *trecho*

pres act subj 1 plur

"to run"

In Greek Grammar,

the action of the aorist ptcp: lay aside

precedes the action of the verb: run

Also:

This construction indicates that "lay aside" must take place before you can "run."

Lay aside (aor mid ptcp apotithemi)

desire (aor imperative *epipotheo* "to greatly desire)
