emotion of profound respect and reverence for deity, awe

brotherly love

to continue, remain, abide

Rom. 12:10, "Be kindly affectionate [philadelphia] to one another with brotherly love [philostorge], in honor giving preference to one another;"

1 Thess. 4:9, "But concerning brotherly love you have no need that I should write to you, for you yourselves are taught by God to love [agapao] one another;"

John 13:34, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love [agapao] one another; as I have loved [agapao] you, that you also love [agapao] one another.

John 13:35, "By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love [agapao] for one another."

John 15:10, "If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love.

John 15:13, "Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends."

1 Pet. 1:22, "Since you have purified [hagnizo, to sanctify, set apart (perf act part)] your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently [ektenos constantly] with a pure [katharos cleansed] heart,"

2 Pet. 1:7, "to godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love [agape]."

Heb. 13:2, "Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by so doing some have unwittingly entertained angels."

Heb. 13:3, "Remember the prisoners as if chained with them—those who are mistreated—since you yourselves are in the body also."

Heb. 13:4, "Marriage is honorable among all, and the bed undefiled; but fornicators and adulterers God will judge." Heb. 13:5, "Let your conduct be without covetousness; be content with such things as you have. For He Himself has said, 'I will never leave you nor forsake you.'"

Gen. 28:15, "Behold, I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land; for I will not leave you until I have done what I have spoken to you."

Deut. 31:6, "Be strong and of good courage, do not fear nor be afraid of them; for the LORD your God, He is the One who goes with you. He will not leave you nor forsake you."

Deut. 31:8, "And the LORD, He is the One who goes before you. He will be with you, He will not leave you nor forsake you; do not fear nor be dismayed."
