

responsibility in the process of repentance. Such phrases would include the following: "incline your heart unto the Lord your God" (Josh. 24:23); "circumcise yourselves to the Lord" (Jer. 4:4); "wash your heart from wickedness" (4:14); "break up your fallow ground" (Hos. 10:12) and so forth. All these expressions of man's penitential activity, however, are subsumed and summarized by this one verb and. For better than any other verb it combines in itself the two requisites of repentance: to turn from evil and to turn to the good.
