Matt. 28:5, “But the angel answered and said to the women, ‘Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified.

Matt. 28:6, “ ‘He is not here; for He is risen, as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay.

Matt. 28:7, “ ‘And go quickly and tell His disciples that He is risen from the dead, and indeed He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him. Behold, I have told you.’ ”

Mark 16:4, “But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away—for it was very large.

Mark 16:5, “And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed.

Mark 16:6, “But he said to them, ‘Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him.

Mark 16:7, “ ‘But go, tell His disciples—and Peter—that He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him, as He said to you.’ ”

Luke 24:2, “But they found the stone rolled away from the tomb.

Luke 24:3, “Then they went in and did not find the body of the Lord Jesus.

Luke 24:4, “And it happened, as they were greatly perplexed about this, that behold, two men stood by them in shining garments.

Luke 24:5, “Then, as they were afraid and bowed their faces to the earth, they said to them, ‘Why do you seek the living among the dead?’

Luke 24:6, “ ‘He is not here, but is risen! Remember how He spoke to you when He was still in Galilee,’ ”

Matt. 26:32, “But after I have been raised, I will go before you to Galilee.”

Matt. 26:32, “But after I have been raised, I will go before you to Galilee.”

Matt. 28:10, “Then Jesus said to them, ‘Do not be afraid. Go and tell My brethren to go to Galilee, and there they will see Me.’ ”

Why the Repetition?

Matt. 16:21, “From that time Jesus began to show to His disciples that He must go to Jerusalem, and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised the third day.”

Mark 8:31, “And He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things, and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again.”

Mark 9:9, “Now as they came down from the mountain, He commanded them that they should tell no one the things they had seen, till the Son of Man had risen from the dead.

Mark 9:10, “So they kept this word to themselves, questioning what the rising from the dead meant.

Mark 9:31, “For He taught His disciples and said to them, ‘The Son of Man is being betrayed into the hands of men, and they will kill Him. And after He is killed, He will rise the third day.’ ”

Luke 18:33, “They will scourge Him and kill Him. And the third day He will rise again.”

Luke 9:45, “But they did not understand this saying, and it was hidden from them so that they did not perceive it; and they were afraid to ask Him about this saying.”

Matt. 28:17, “When they saw Him, they worshiped Him; but some doubted.”

Mark 16:10, “She went and told those who had been with Him, as they mourned and wept.

Mark 16:11, “And when they heard that He was alive and had been seen by her, they did not believe.”

Luke 24:38, “And He said to them, ‘Why are you troubled? And why do doubts arise in your hearts?’ ”

Luke 24:9, “Then they returned from the tomb and told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest.

Luke 24:10, “It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them, who told these things to the apostles.

Luke 24:11, “And their words seemed to them like idle tales, and they did not believe them.

Luke 24:12, “But Peter arose and ran to the tomb; and stooping down, he saw the linen cloths lying by themselves; and he departed, marveling to himself at what had happened.”

John 20:8, “Then the other disciple, who came to the tomb first, went in also; and he saw and believed.

John 20:9, “For as yet they did not know the Scripture, that He must rise again from the dead.”

Luke 18:34, “But they understood none of these things; this saying was hidden from them, and they did not know the things which were spoken.”

John 20:11, “But Mary stood outside by the tomb weeping, and as she wept she stooped down and looked into the tomb.”

John 20:14, “Now when she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, and did not know that it was Jesus.

John 20:15, “Jesus said to her, ‘Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?’ She, supposing Him to be the gardener, said to Him, ‘Sir, if You have carried Him away, tell me where You have laid Him, and I will take Him away.’

John 20:16, “Jesus said to her, ‘Mary!’ She turned and said to Him, ‘Rabboni!’ (which is to say, Teacher).”

John 20:17, “Jesus said to her, ‘Do not cling to Me, for I have not yet ascended to My Father; but go to My brethren and say to them, “I am ascending to My Father and your Father, and to My God and your God.” ’

John 20:18, “Mary Magdalene came and told the disciples that she had seen the Lord, and that He had spoken these things to her.”

Mark 16:9, “Now when He rose early on the first day of the week, He appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom He had cast seven demons.

Mark 16:10, “She went and told those who had been with Him, as they mourned and wept.”

Matt. 28:9, “And as they went to tell His disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, ‘Rejoice!’ So they came and held Him by the feet and worshiped Him.

Matt. 28:10, “Then Jesus said to them, ‘Do not be afraid. Go and tell My brethren to go to Galilee, and there they will see Me.’ ”
