be level, straight, (up) right, just, lawful.

רְשָׁע rasha – Wicked, criminal.

This masculine noun appears over 266 times, mostly in Job, Ps., Prov., and Ezek. It is used in parallel with almost every Hebrew word for sin, evil, and iniquity. TDOT Prov. 4:15, "<u>Avoid</u> it, do not travel on it; Turn away from it and pass on."

יְבָר (*ʿābar*)

pass over, by, through, alienate, bring, carry, do away, take, take away, transgress Prov. 4:16, "For they do not sleep unless they have done evil; And their sleep is taken away unless they make someone fall." Prov. 4:16, "For they do not sleep unless they have done evil; And their sleep is taken away unless they make someone fall."

לַשָּׁל (kāshal)

stumble, totter, stagger (usually from weakness or weariness, or in flight from attackers) Prov. 4:17, "For they eat the bread of wickedness, And drink the wine of violence." Prov. 4:17, "For they eat the bread of <u>wickedness</u>, And drink the wine of violence."

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> קַמַס (*ḥāmas*) wrong, do violence to, treat violently. Used seven times in the Qal, once in the Niphal.
