When BECAUSE follows a comma, it links to the previous clause.

The least common use of BECAUSE begins the sentence, this is called the *suspensive* use of *hoti*.

Out of about 450 uses of the causal HOTI, grammarians recognize only 12 as suspensive (2%).

John uses *HOTI* about 180 times and only 11 times is it suspensive.



The meaning of τηρέω *tēréō*;

Tereo is often translated "keep;" sometimes with the sense of obey, but also with the sense of protect or reserve.






The Rapture occurs at the end of the Tribulation, forcing all believers to endure the entire seven years.
