

Why Study Prophecy?

28% of the Bible was prophetic when revealed.

15% of the Bible is still unfulfilled prophecy.

18% of the New Testament epistles, 1 out of every 5 verses is unfulfilled prophecy.

1 in 12 verses in the New Testament refer to the Second Coming of Christ.

1 in 10 verses in the epistles refer to the Second Coming of Christ.

60% of verses in the NT are affected by eschatology issues to be properly understood.


Prophecy is not something given to satisfy human curiosity about the future, but to remind us of God's character.

539 B. C. – 331 B. C. Medo-Persia


331 B. C. – 146 B. C. Greece

Dan. 2:46, "Then King Nebuchadnezzar fell on his face and did homage to Daniel, and gave orders to present to him an offering and fragrant incense.

Dan. 2:47, "The king answered Daniel and said, 'Surely your God is a God of gods and a Lord of kings and a revealer of mysteries, since you have been able to reveal this mystery." Dan. 2:48, "Then the king promoted Daniel and gave him many great gifts, and he made him ruler over the whole province of Babylon and chief prefect over all the wise men of Babylon."



Dan. 3:28, "Nebuchadnezzar responded and said, 'Blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abed-nego, who has sent His angel and delivered His servants who put their trust in Him, violating the king's command, and yielded up their bodies so as not to serve or worship any god except their own God.' Dan. 5:22, "Yet you, his son, Belshazzar, have not humbled your heart, even though you knew all this,

Dan. 5:23, "but you have exalted yourself against the Lord of heaven; and they have brought the vessels of His house before you, and you and your nobles, your wives and your concubines have been drinking wine from them; and you have praised the gods of silver and gold, of bronze, iron, wood and stone, which do not see, hear or understand. But the God in whose hand are your life-breath and all your ways, you have not glorified."

PERES consonants = P R S

The same consonants as **PERSIA**
