The Epistle to the ROMANS



Rom. 1:17, "For in it [the gospel] the righteousness [δικαιοσύνη, dikaiosune] of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written,

'The righteous [δίκαιος, dikaios] shall live by faith.' "

Rom. 1:18, "For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness [ἀδικίᾳ, adikia] of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, [ἀδικίᾳ, adikia]"

Psa. 62:12, "Also to You, O Lord, belongs mercy; for You render to each one according to his work."

Prov. 24:12, "If you say, 'Surely we did not know this,' Does not He who weighs the hearts consider it? He who keeps your soul, does He not know it? And will He not render to each man according to his deeds?"


Matt. 16:27, "For the Son of Man will come in the glory of His Father with His angels, and then He will reward each according to his works."


Rev. 20:13, "The sea gave up the dead who were in it, and Death and Hades delivered up the dead who were in them. And they were judged, each one according to his works."



"All our works of RIGHTEOUSNESS are filthy rags," Isa. 64:6








Isaiah 64:6

Question:

What about statements that a person dies in their sin?

"in your sins," John 8:24

1 Cor. 15:17, "And if Christ is not risen, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins!"

"in your sins" = being spiritually dead, Eph. 2:1

"in your sins" is not the same as "for your sins."

Eph. 2:8, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God,

Eph. 2:9, "not of works, lest anyone should boast."

Titus 3:5, "not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to His mercy He saved us, through the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit,"

Gal. 2:16, "knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law but by faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, that we might be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law; for by the works of the law no flesh shall be justified." Rom. 3:28, "Therefore we conclude that a man is justified by faith apart from the deeds of the law."

Rom. 11:6, "And if by grace, then it is no longer of works; otherwise grace is no longer grace. But if it is of works, it is no longer grace; otherwise work is no longer work."
